

## A Note on Using the C Compiler Packages M3T-NC308WA and M3T-NC30WA --On Using the labs and abs Functions--

Please take note of the following problem in using for the M32C series (M3T-NC308WA); and for the M16C series (M3T-NC30WA) of MCUs:

- On using the labs and abs functions
- 

### 1. Versions Concerned

M3T-NC30WA V.1.00 Release 1 ~ V.5.30 Release 02

M3T-NC308WA V.1.00 Release 1 ~ V.5.40 Release 00

### 2. Description

Calculating an absolute value using the labs or abs function may result in an incorrect value being obtained.

#### 2.1 Conditions

This problem occurs if the following conditions are all satisfied:

- (1) The standard header file `stdlib.h` is included.
- (2) The `labs` or `abs` function takes an expression as an argument.

#### 2.2 Example

```
-----  
#include <stdlib.h>          /* Condition (1) */
```

```
unsigned int b=10;  
unsigned int a=8;
```

```
unsigned int result;  
void func(void)
```

```
{  
    result=abs(a - b);    /* Condition (2) */  
}
```

---

### 3. Workaround

After including `stdlib.h`, disable the `labs` macro using preprocessing directive `#undef labs` or disable the `abs` macro using preprocessing directive `#undef`.

Example:

---

```
#include <stdlib.h>  
#undef abs          /* Disable abs macro */  
unsigned int b=10;  
unsigned int a=8;  
  
unsigned int result;  
void func(void)  
{  
    result=abs( a-b );  
}
```

---

### 4. Schedule of Fixing the Problem
