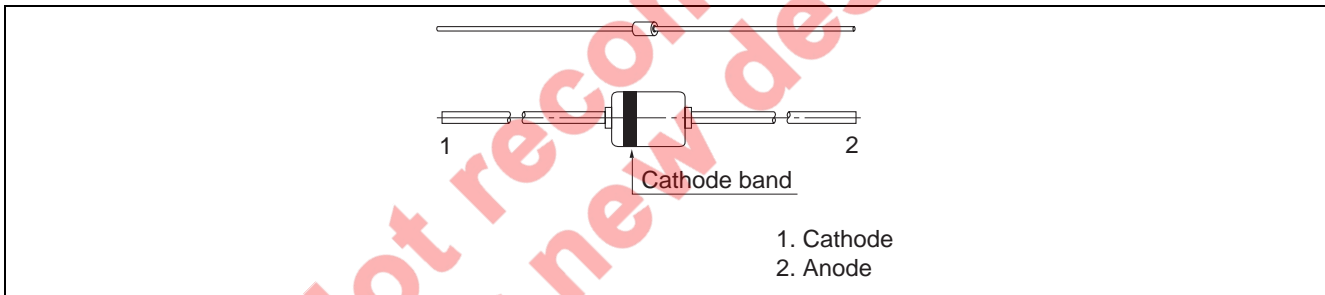

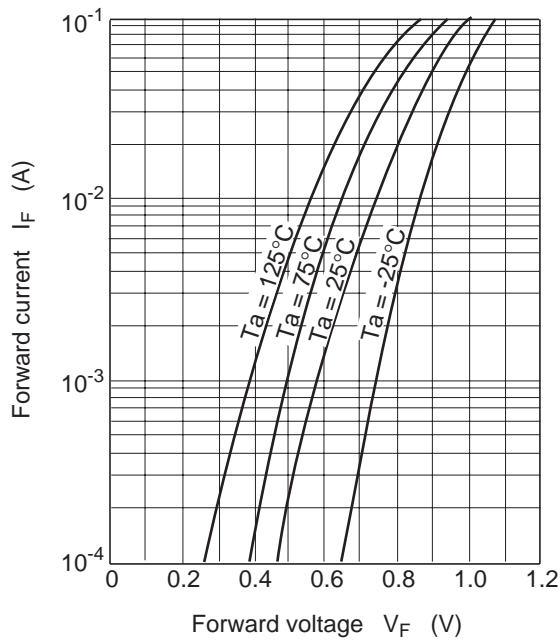


Fig.1 Forward current vs. Forward voltage

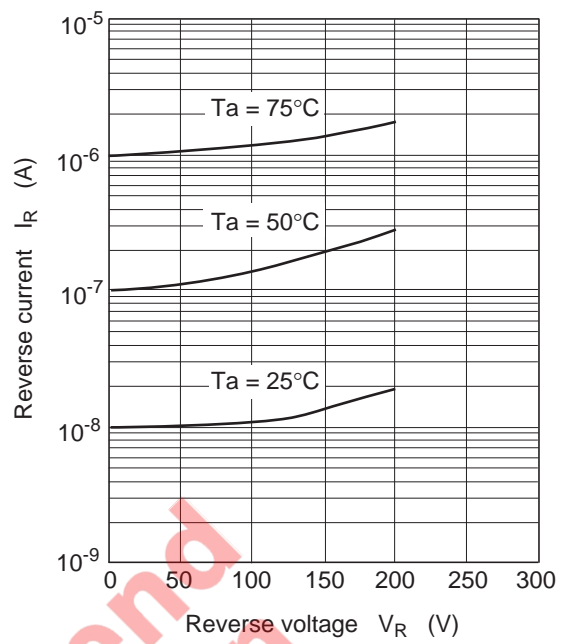


Fig.2 Reverse current vs. Reverse voltage

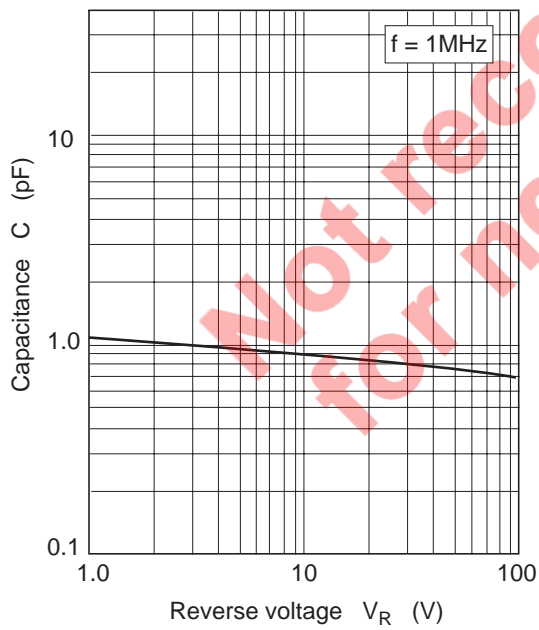
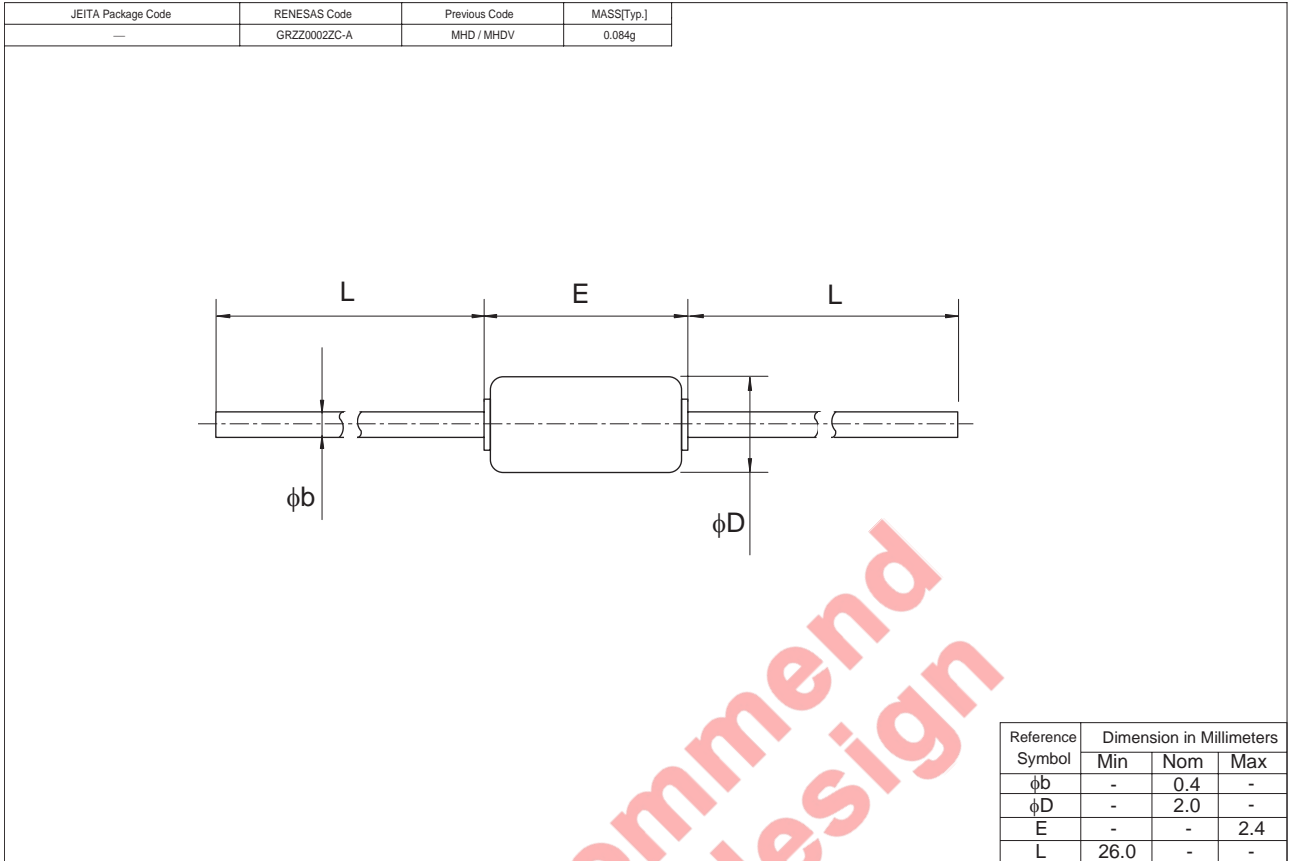


Fig.3 Capacitance vs. Reverse voltage
